Homemade Carton Bird Feeder



You will need a juice carton, scissors, string, a small stick, paint or pens for decorating.

With help from an adult, cut a shape out of opposite sides of the carton. Make sure you leave approximately 5cm at the base of the carton.



If you want to decorate your carton and they are brightly coloured we recommend giving them a cover of white before you decorate. This means your patterns will show clearer.



Paint or colour in your carton using any design you wish!



At the top of the carton make a hole, use your string to thread through and tie to make a hanger.

At the base of your carton make another hole on both side and use a stick to push through. This is for the bird to land on to feed!

Fill up with bird seed and hang in your garden to see who visits!

Egg Carton Easter Chick



1. Cut two cups from an egg carton. The best type of carton to use is the cardboard kind. It soaks up paint much better. You can try using the foam kind, but the paint may not stick as well. Make sure that you cut the cups apart so that they are two separate pieces. Trim the edges so that they are nice and smooth. You want a nice round shape.



2. Tape the cups together along one edge. Set the cups down, side by side, with the inside facing up. Fold a strip of masking tape over the edges where the cups are touching. This tape will act as a hinge. For extra security, close the cups, and add a strip of tape on the outside. Make sure that it's on the same side as the inside tape. You want to be able to open and close your chick.



3.Paint the inside and outside of the cups. Paint inside first (easier to hold this way round), then the outside. The best paint to use is yellow acrylic but any will do the job! Leave to dry while you make the chick's features.

4. Wings and Beak. Cut two orange and two yellow triangle shapes for the beak and wings. Make the all triangles a little bit taller than you want them to be. This will allow you to attach them to the chick with glue. The triangles should be the same size, and no larger than the bottom of your egg cups. The yellow triangles can be the same size as the beak, or a little bit bigger. Glue the beak pieces to the top and bottom cups. Draw a line of glue along the bottom edges of the orange triangles. Press the triangles against the *inside* top and bottom edges of the egg cups. The bottom is the cup that has the feet attached. The upper cup should only have the beak piece attached. Fold the beak and wings down. When you glued the beak and wing pieces down, they were sticking straight up. This is not very chick-like, so fold them down over the edges of the egg cup. Don't worry if they stick out a little.



5. Chick Feet. You will need two pieces. Make sure that they are smaller than the base of your egg carton cup. Glue the feet to the bottom of your chick. Make sure that the toes are pointing *away* from the hinge, and that they are sticking out from under the chick. The hinge will be on the back of the chick.




- **6.** Add some eyes to the top cup. Close the chick and turn it so that the beak is facing you. Use a black marker to draw two dots on the top cup, right above the beak. You can also glue on two tiny googly eyes instead.
- 7. Fill the chick with candy, if desired.

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













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
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Alternative Easter Hunts

1. Nature Hunt - What natural items would the Easter Bunny like? On a walk near you, take a basket or container and see what natural goodies you can find and offer to the Easter Rabbit in exchange for an egg.

2. Easter Rabbits Reversed - Get the roles reversed, the children hide the eggs and the adults hunt. If you play by the normal rules any eggs you find you get to keep too!

3. Eggs-ercise Hunt - Complete physical challenges to earn eggs e.g. 10 star jumps, 5 push ups, 20 ball bounces etc.

4. House work Hunt - Tired of doing all the housework yourself - set the children to work to earn their Easter eggs e.g. sweeping, tidying away toys, laying the table for meals.

5. Puzzle Piece Hunt - Inside the eggs hide a piece of a jigsaw. To win the egg the child must complete the jigsaw!

6. Hoppin' Hunt - Inside the eggs or as challenges encourage the children to complete movements or sounds like animals e.g. hop like a rabbit around the garden, moo like a cow, drink water from a bowl like a dog, stomp like an elephant etc.

7. Treasure Hunt - Give your child clues as to where the egg might be e.g. Follow the clues for a gift for you, the first one is easy, it's in your shoe! And Scrub-a-dub-dub, I'm in the ...?


8. Egg and Spoon Obstacle - For your child to win their egg they have to complete an obstacle course while balancing their egg on a spoon, get them going round in circles, under things, up the stairs, and around things.

9. Scrambled - Give the children letters either using plastic ones or written on card and cut up. The letters should make the word where an egg is hiding e.g. EFRDIG would be FRIDGE.

10. Follow the string - This requires a lot of string and agility. Set up a trail for your child to follow to their prize!

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


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


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


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
