Let's keep up the enthusiasm and finish the year as the successful, wonderful, happy children we all know!



#### **PREVENT:**

What is the PREVENT Strategy?

Prevent is a government strategy designed to stop people becoming terrorists or supporting terrorist or extremist causes

We have a PREVENT Strategy on our website which explains how we keep our children safe from radicalisation as well as a PREVENT Risk assessment. Please do have a look to understand our responsibilities as a school.

## **Private Fostering:**

When a child/young person under 16 years old (18 years old if they have a disability) is looked after for a period of 28 days or more by someone who is not a parent, legal guardian or person with parental responsibility this is defined as Private Fostering and schools have a legal duty to report any Private Fostering arrangements to the Local Authority. Schools must be clear about who has parental responsibility for children on their roll.

If this is something that applies to you please contact Mrs Terrey to discuss this.

## The Bank of Dreams and Nightmares Workshops:

We are thrilled to have the talented artists at The Bank of Dreams and Nightmares in on Monday 12<sup>th</sup> December to work with Sycamore Class and Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> December to work with Hazel Class to devise and design their very own story books! We know how talented our children are and it is such a brilliant scheme for them to take part in.

#### COVID:

Government Advice: If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result they should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test, if they can.

After 3 days, if they feel well and do not have a high temperature, the risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower. This is because children and young people tend to be infectious to other people for less time than adults.

Children and young people who usually go to school, college or childcare and who live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test result should continue to attend as normal.

#### STREP A - Advice:

With the current media attention, it is understandable that you may be concerned about STREP A. There is information and advice contained within the UKHSA update on scarlet fever and invasive Group A strep - GOV.UK (www.gov.uk), and on the NHS 111 Website.

Ill-health absence advice remains the same. Children should be kept at home if too unwell to attend school, and that they should return to school once well enough to do so, unless told otherwise by a medical professional. If an adult or child has scarlet fever they should stay away from nursery, school or work for 24 hours after taking the first dose of antibiotics.

We encourage our children that good hand and respiratory hygiene are important for stopping the spread of many bugs, including Group A Strep. By teaching children how to wash their hands properly with soap for 20 seconds, using a tissue to catch coughs and sneezes, and keeping away from others when feeling unwell, they will be able to reduce the risk of picking up or spreading infections.

#### Advent:

Advent comes from the Latin word meaning "coming." Jesus is coming, and Advent is intended to be a season of preparation for His arrival.

Advent is meant to be a period of self-preparation.

The purple color associated with Advent is also the color of penance.
