#### School Times – Drop Off:

Our school day starts at 8.30am. Please don't drop off your children and leave them any earlier as there is no adult supervision before this. We do have a wonderful Breakfast Club which runs from 7.30am daily that you are welcome to enter your child into. Ask at the Office for more info should you need to leave your child earlier than 8.30am.

### **School Times - Collection:**

Our school day finishes at 3pm and, on the odd occasion when plans go wrong, we are happy to supervise your children if you are a few minutes late. However, if children are persistently collected after 3pm they will be placed in the After School Club and parents and carers will be charged.

# After School Club:

The paid for After School Club is already very well attended. The cost is  $\pounds 3$  per hour (with a sibling discount) and it runs from 3pm till 5:30pm every day. If you would like your child to attend, please let Miss Fearn know in the office.

# Absence:

We have had clear instruction from the Dorset Local Authority that no holidays will be authorised during term time and that Dorset Council will start to fine parents who take their children out of school. It is the expectation that children attend school every day unless there is a very good reason for absence, such as illness.

The children will never be so able and open to learning as when they are at Primary School and instilling a love of learning at a young age will help them continue, happily, in education.

The fines are up to  $\pounds$ 60 per child per day. If a child attends for less than 95% this is equivalent to missing one day a fortnight which equates to four weeks in a year.
