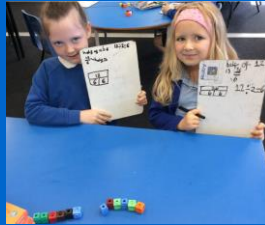
Reception 'First Class Photos':
